All Saints & All Souls. On November 1, the Feast of All Saints, we celebrate the communion of saints, those here on Earth and those in Heaven. In the Society, we are blessed to have our Vincentian saints and models of charity: Our patron saint of charity, St. Vincent de Paul, of course! We celebrate his wonderful associate, St. Louise de Marillac, who carried out the spirit and letter of Vincent's vision of charity. Our Vincentian family of saints includes St. Catherine Laboure, of the Miraculous Medal, which feast we celebrate in November. Among our "modern" Vincentian family saints, we honor St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. And there are others, such as the Vincentian Martyrs of Spain (see, Manual, ch. 4.5). In the category of "blessed," we patiently pray for the canonizations of the Society's principal co-founder, Bl. Frederic Ozanam, and his associate, Bl. Sr. Rosalie Rendu. On November 2, the Feast of All Souls, we celebrate and call to mind—and heart—the members of our Vincentian family who now rest in the Lord: "For our deceased members, associates, benefactors, and the

poor" (our prayer at each conference meeting). I fondly recall as a mentor, Art Guerrero, who served on the Council, led our Thrift Store efforts, and for years helped the poor in his community. It was Art who taught me about the Voice of the Poor. This November marks the 2nd anniversary of the dedication of a community park named after Art, where we held our annual "Vincentian family" picnic in June. I like to think of Art as being among our local Vincentian "saints." In November, we remember especially our deceased Vincentians with loving thoughts and prayers, confident in faith that they, too, are among the saints in Heaven. -Paul Starkey, Sacramento Diocesan Council President

SVdP Disaster Relief Update: Butte and Valley Fires. Phil Niederberger, who leads the Sacramento Council's Disaster Relief team, reports on the recent Long Term



Disaster Committee Meeting held in San Andreas this month: "Attending were some 50 plus public assistance agencies, non-profit, faith-based organizations, including Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), California Office of Emergency Services, and several VOADs (Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters). Committee officers were appointed and chairs for Volunteers, Fundraising,

Construction, and Case-management were established. SVdP will participate [in three significant ways] in supplying volunteers when needed, Construction (House in a Box or HIB when qualified), and case-management." This week, **Phil** is at the Disaster Relief Center in Calaveras, along with **Nancy Bain**, Stockton District Council President, and **Kevin Darr**, St. Katherine Drexel Conference President, and other volunteers (including **Rachel Crane** and Conference President **Cathy O'Neil**, of St. Joseph, Elk Grove). **Phil** writes: "Yesterday [October 24] was a reality check on what has happened in Calaveras County. We spent most of the day dispensing food and fuel cards and completing HIB applications for the wildfire victims who have no insurance but whose dwellings were destroyed. It was a heartfelt day, to say the least." (Editor's note: Since late September, the Sacramento Council has been coordinating with districts and conferences, as well as the Diocese of Sacramento and SVDPUSA Disaster Relief, concerning immediate and long-term relief efforts for those impacted by the fires. *Many thanks to our volunteers and to the conferences, members, and benefactors who have donated toward fire disaster relief efforts.)*
