"Getting Ahead" Participants to Graduate. The Getting Ahead program at St. Martin Conference, Esparto nears completion of its 20-week course, reports Chelsea Becker. "Together the six original participants [have investigated] the causes of poverty, how to build their resources, and setting goals to change their lives." Graduation is April 7,

2016, at St. Martin Hall, 25633 Grafton Street, Esparto, with dinner at 5 p.m. followed by graduation at 6 p.m. Participants will share what they have learned with community members and present their individual plans for Getting Ahead. In January, **Chelsea** coordinated a Mentor Training which included information about the Getting Ahead program for conferences considering bringing that systemic change program to their communities.
