

conversation about racism in our church





PREDATORY LENDING

Currently in California there is NO interest rate cap on loans above \$2,500, and predatory lenders are charging interest rates of 100% even 300% APR.

The Center for Responsible Lending has joined with Faith leaders from across the state and are making their way through different cities to urge CA legislators to protect Californians from these lenders. Please join them in Sacramento on June 13th to learn how you can help pass a historic bill to cap interest rates. They will provide resources for community members who are stuck in these debt traps.
